	<i>Turkish Orange*</i>	80-90	2 oz.		<i>Unique, brilliant orange fruits-great for stuffing! Round, sweet &amp; fragrant!</i>
	Udumalapet	80-90	3" long		Light green, egg-shaped fruit w/purple streaks. Rare eggplant from India, great for curries & chutneys
GOURD	<i>Ornamental mix*</i>	95			<i>Eight kinds of early maturing types -small spoon, bicolored pear &amp; small orange.</i>

HUCKLEBERRY	<i>Chichiquelite</i>	75-85	½"		<i>Sprawling 3-4' plant producing hundreds of black berries; great for making pies!</i>
PEPPER	Fish	80	2"		In the 1900's this hot pepper was primarily used by the African American community. Curving pepper w/distinctive green & white mottled foliage w/stripping, resembling a little swimming fish
	Holy Mole'	85	7-9" long		A 2007 AAS winner! Early crops produce chocolate-brown, mildly spicy peppers on sturdy plants. Great for Mexico's famous Molé sauc
	Klari Baby Cheese	65	4 oz.		Heirloom from Hungary, flattened fruits ripen from white to yellow to red. Mild & sweet.
	The Big Early	70	8x4½"	[F1]	Huge, crisp, sweet thick-walled pepper. Great stuffer pepper. Tobacco Mosaic resistant.
MELON	<i>Asian Sun Jewel*</i>	68	7"x3½"	[F1,DM,PM]	<i>Extra early Asian melon. Outside is lemon-yellow, inside is white, sweet &amp; crisp.</i>
	<i>Comet Bitter Melon*</i>	50	7-8" long	[F1]	<i>Bitter gourds are cucumber shape w/pebbly skin &amp; bitter flavor prized in Asian cuisines.</i>
	<i>Lambkin*</i>	65-75	2-4 lb.	[F1]	<i>New AAS winner! Very unusual, early-maturing dessert melon w/white flesh.</i>
PUMPKIN	<i>Prizewinner*</i>	115		F1	<i>Early maturing Giant type, but 2/3 the size &amp; brighter orange.</i>
SQUASH	<i>Blue Ballet Hubbard*</i>	95	4-6 lb.		<i>Smooth-skinned, blue-gray fruits w/sweeter orange, fiberless flesh!</i>
	Buttercup	100-105	3 lb.		<i>Turban-like shape, winter squash w/sweet, deep orange flesh. Easy to store.</i>
